



## **FAQ about TKC:**

What is Triangle Kids Camp like?

Worship services and Small Groups make up the two most important parts of a day at camp. Worship services include drama, praise and worship lead by the TKC Band, and sound biblical teaching from our Camp Pastor. Small Groups are an essential element of TKC. Each Small Group is made up of 9-12 students, and at least one adult leader, all of which are from your church. Oh yeah, there are also a slew of crazy fun activities thrown in there!

Who can attend Triangle Kids Camp?

TKC is for kids entering 1st-6th grades in the Fall of 2011.

What is the cost of the camp?

\$215—this includes everything you need to survive at camp. You may need to charge your group extra for transportation to and from camp. Please review the Dates for price change

Is the price for camp the same for adults and children?

Yes.

When do I need to register by?

Register as soon as you know your bring your group. Please review the Financial Guidelines for details.

What will adult leaders do at camp?

Most adults will serve as small group leaders. We will also ask if some of your volunteers would help lead various activities. This helps us keep the costs low (you know families like that!). TKC is a wonderful opportunity for your adult leaders to interact with and thereby grow relationships with the students in your ministry.

How many adults do I need to bring with me?

We request one adult for every five students. You must also have both male and female chaperones if you have children of both genders attending.

What will Children's Ministers do at camp?

TKC is designed for Children's Ministers to be free from a lot of responsibility so they can spend time building relationships with their students.

### **Bible Studies**

- Bible studies are done by your church volunteers with your own kids. As camp nears, you will receive instructions about how to download those studies as well as how to organize your whole group into smaller Bible study groups. This information will be submitted with the rooming assignments.
- Any materials needed to conduct the Bible studies will be your responsibility to collect. You can either gather these all yourself for each group or have the particular Bible study leader you have assigned do this. Triangle Kids Camp will not provide any materials.

### **Activities**

- Each day, kids will go to an activity track which they have chosen at Camp. You may be asked to provide volunteers to lead these activities based on information given in the registration process. You will also need to ensure that one of your volunteers is at each activity that any of your children attend. Details for those activity choices will be provided as camp gets closer.



## **FAQ about TKC:**

### **Rooming Assignments**

- You will be responsible for assigning your children to specific roommates. You will be emailed a spreadsheet prior to camp that will need to be submitted back to camp leadership. All are 2 people per room, therefore no unrelated adults are allowed to stay in a room with a child. When we receive your assignments, we will place adult rooms in strategic locations so that you may supervise your children adequately.

### **Insurance Liability and Child Waiver**

- Your church must provide a \$1 million Insurance Certificate of Liability in order to attend this camp. Louisburg College must be listed as “Additionally Insured.” Details about when that is due will be provided in a checklist that will be emailed to you a month prior to camp.
- Every child must also have a parent/guardian fill out and sign a liability waiver. You will need to have 2 copies of this: one for you and one for the camp leadership.

### **What We Provide**

- As part of the camp fee, every person receives: meals, lodging, T-shirt, camp booklet, nametag, room key (must be returned), and all supplies for activities.

### **More Stuff You Really Gotta’ Know**

- The cost of camp is \$215. You may want to increase that slightly for your kids to cover any expenses you could incur. Expenses may include—paying for chaperones, nightly snacks, transportation costs, etc.
- It is very important that you conduct a “Family Meeting” (campers included) prior to camp. At this meeting you’ll want to:
  - o Inform families of your departure and return schedule
  - o Provide contact information
  - o Go over to-bring and not-to-bring lists
  - o Collect final balances
  - o Get waivers filled out
  - o Allow children to choose roommates
  - o Allow children to choose activity tracks
  - o Go over church specific discipline/trip guidelines



## FAQ about TKC:

- Each night, the schedule allows for a Church Group Time. Your church will be assigned a specific room or location on campus. During that time you discuss the day, do some application on the Bible studies, have the Camp Pastor or Worship Leader come share their testimony, or whatever you want. This is your time with your kids, you dictate what goes on!
- Triangle Kids Camp will not make provisions to have medical staff on location. Therefore, it is your responsibility to bring along a first aid kit and to manage any of your children's medications based on parental instructions.
- Special Needs Children: All children are welcome at Triangle Kids Camp. If you have registered a child with a special need it is your responsibility to provide a "buddy" to care for the needs of that child. Keep in mind that children who are physically disabled may be somewhat limited in the outdoor games we do each day.
